
Twenty-two percent of Filipinos are poor in the first semester of 2023

The first semester 2023 poverty incidence among population or the proportion of poor Filipinos whose per capita income is not sufficient to meet their basic food and non-food needs was estimated at 22.4 percent or 25.24 million Filipinos. On the average, a family of five members will need at least PhP13,797 per month to meet their minimum basic food and non-food needs in the first semester of 2023. On the other hand, subsistence incidence among **Filipinos** or proportion of Filipinos whose income is not enough to buy even the basic food needs was registered at 8.7 percent or about 9.79 million Filipinos in the first semester

of 2023. On the average, the monthly food threshold for a family of five in the same period was estimated at PhP 9,550. (Figure 1, and Tables 2, 4, 6, and 8)

Among families, the First Semester 2023 poverty incidence was estimated at 16.4 percent, which was equivalent to 4.51 million poor families. Meanwhile, the subsistence incidence among families was recorded at 5.9 percent or about 1.62 million food poor families in the first semester of 2023. (Tables 1, 3, 5, and 7)
