



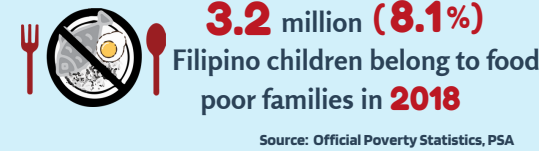

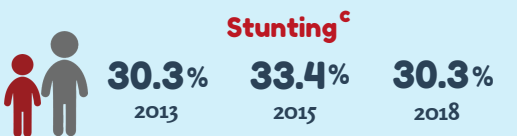
Poverty Incidence among Children^a

Prevalence of Selected Nutritional Status Among Children Under 5 Years of Age

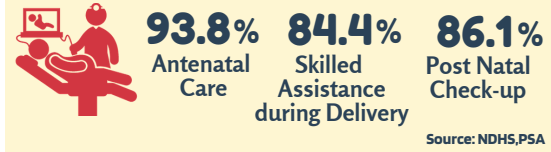

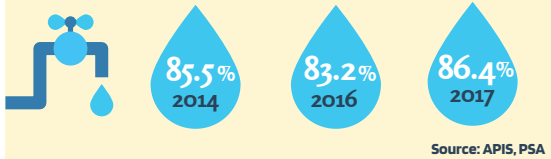

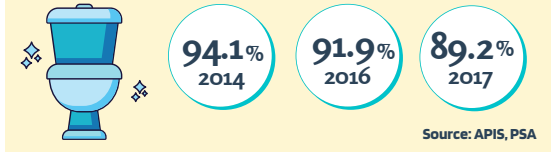
Percentage of Women^f aged 15 - 49 who received Maternal Healthcare Services: 2017

Proportion of Families with Access to Sanitary Toilet Facility

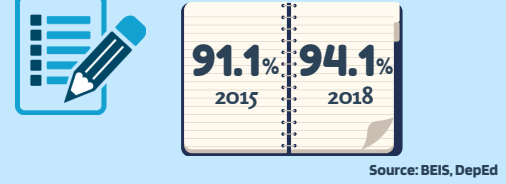


Adolescent Birth Rate (birth rate per 1,000 women aged 15-19 years old)

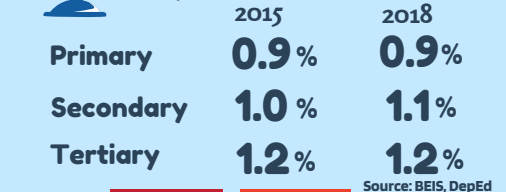
Cohort Survival Rate of Elementary Students^g

Footnotes/Acronym

b - Subsistence Incidence is the proportion of families or individuals with per capita income less than the per capita food threshold to the total number of families or individuals.
c - Height-for-age d - Weight-for-age e - Weight-for-height f - with livebirth in the five years preceding the survey
g - Cohort Survival Rate is the proportion of enrollees at the beginning grade or year who reached the final grade or year at the end of the required number of years of study.
h - Gender Parity Index is the ratio of female to male values of a given indicator.
