Poor refers to "Individuals and families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by the National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA) and/or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing and other essential amenities of life. (Section 3 of the RA No. 8425).

## **POVERTY THRESHOLD**

**POVERTY INCIDENCE** is the proportion of families or individuals with income less than the Poverty Threshold to the total number of families

is the minimum income required for a family or individual to meet the basic food and non-food needs. It is also known as the POVERTY LINE.



A Filipino needed at least

PhP 2,759

on average, per month to meet his/her basic food

and non-food needs in the first semester of 2023.

A Filipino family with five members needed around

PhP 13,797

on average, per month

to meet their basic food and non-food needs in the first semester of 2023.

> PhP 12,082 2021 First Semester

> PhP 10,532 2018 First Semester

is the minimum income required for a family or individual to meet the basic food needs, which satisfy the nutritional requirements for economically necessary and socially desirable physical activities.




