Number of Establishments

The preliminary results of the Annual Survey of Philippine Business and Industry (ASPBI) showed that a total of 405 establishments in the formal sector of the economy were engaged in electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply in 2019. (Tables A and 1)



Employment

This sector employed a total of 55,645 workers of which 55,467 workers or 99.7 percent were paid workers, while the rest were working owners and unpaid workers. On the average, there were 137 workers employed per establishment. (Tables A, 1 and 2)

Compensation

Total compensation paid by the sector in 2019 amounted to PhP 46.86 billion, translating to an average annual compensation of PhP 844.80 thousand per paid employee. (Tables A, 1 and 2)

Revenue and Expense

In 2019, the total revenue generated by the sector amounted to PhP 1,176.12 billion, while total expense incurred amounted to PhP 990.37 billion. This can be translated to a revenue-expense ratio of 1.19, which implies that for every peso spent there is a corresponding 1.19 pesos revenue generated. (Tables A and 1)

Subsidies

Subsidies provided by the government to support the business operation of the sector in 2019 amounted to PhP 8.82 billion. (Tables A and 1)
