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### **UPDATE ON LAYOFFS** 1995 - 1996

This report contains preliminary summary statistics on worker's layoff for the years 1995 and 1996. This update is based from the *Monthly Report on Employee's Terminations* submitted by employers/establishments to DOLE Regional Offices.

#### ESTABLISHMENT CLOSURES/RETRENCHMENTS

- A total of 1,240 establishments reported closures/retrenchments due to economic reasons in 1996 exceeding by 8.9 percent the 1,139 establishments resorting to closures/retrenchments in 1995.
- By type of retrenchment, the bulk of the reports or 833 were establishments resorting to layoffs of which 713 were permanent layoffs and 120 temporary layoffs. On a worse off situations were 365 establishments that ceased operations during the year, 292 of which were permanent closures and 73 temporary closures. On the other hand, some establishments resorted to job rotations/reduced working time to cope with the difficult situation.
- One-half (50.4% or 625) of establishments reporting closures/retrenchments were engaged in manufacturing. Among the hardest hit were those engaged in the manufacturing of food (88), wearing apparel/garments (85), chemical and chemical products (70), wood and wood products (57), textiles (49) and electrical machinery, apparatus, appliances and supplies (44).
- Majority of the reporting establishments were based in the National Capital Region (686 or 55.3%), Region VII (173 or 14.0%) and **Region XI** (111 or 9.0%). A good number of them were **large-sized establishments** employing 100 workers and more (567 or 45.7%).

#### **WORKERS AFFECTED**

Some 81,627 workers were displaced from their jobs due to economic reasons in 1996. This represents a 30.0 percent increase over the number of workers affected last year at 62,990. Classified according to the form of displacements, 55.2 percent or 45,106 lost their jobs permanently; 39.6

- percent or 32,319 were temporarily laid off; and 5.1 percent or 4,202 worked on rotation/reduced working time.
- Hardest hit by this year's employment cutbacks were three of the country's top export earning industries, namely: electrical machinery, apparatus and supplies (18,223); wearing apparel/ garment (11,397) and textile (9,959). Collectively, they accounted for nearly half (48.5% or 39,579) of total laidoff workers during the year. Heavy job losses were also noted in the following sub-sectors: food (4,100), wood and wood products (3,389) and chemical and chemical products (2,909). For the manufacturing sector as a whole, total displacement of workers was posted at 63,815, a 29.0 percent increment from 19.5 percent registered a year ago.
- For the rest of the major sectoral groups, large increases in layoffs/retrenchments were observed in the community, social and personal services (1,760 to 3,828); and **mining and quarrying** (112 to 3,130).
- The lion's share of the total workers laid off (84.4% or 68,860) were employed by large establishments with 100 or more workforce.
- As to the reasons for layoffs/retrenchments, data showed an upsurge in the number of laid off workers due to lack of market/slump in demand. Specifically, the proportion of workers laid off for 1996 due to this reason rose substantially to 41.0 percent from 26.7 percent in 1995. Lack of capital (23.6%) and higher cost of production (13.2%) were the other two principal reasons for this year's terminations. Layoff due to company streamlining/redundancy was down from 14.4% to 12.0%.
