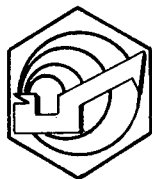

FOREWORD

This second issue of the handbook on *Selected Statistics on Agriculture* contains major revisions of the data presented in the maiden issue. These revisions were deemed necessary out of our concern to provide a more comprehensive statistical information. The changes include: (1) deletion of the GVA regional share; (2) use of calendar year instead of cropyear data for real wage rates; (3) inclusion of agricultural research and extension budget, and estimates of area, production and value of minor crops previously unreported; (4) weighted instead of unweighted value of production for palay and corn; (5) revised data series on rice and corn supply-use, fertilizers, imports of livestock as well as corn and poultry prices; (6) deletion of corn data by variety; and (7) combination of lowland rainfed and upland rice data under rainfed category.

The Bureau of Agricultural Statistics (BAS) is pursuing with more vigor its efforts to improve the Bureau's data collection and validation system in order to provide more consistent and reliable data. Thus, some of the crop and livestock production data in this handbook may have to be revised after the statistical audit is completed. Henceforth, this handbook will be updated continuously and published regularly.

Again, we express our appreciation to the various government agencies for their assistance/cooperation which contributed much to the publication of this handbook.
